Black Land	fertile soil on either side of the Nile
Cataracts	Rapids formed caused by rough terrain; waterfalls
Delta	A triangle-shaped area of land made from soil deposited by a river
Dynasty	A series of rulers from the same family

Elite	People of wealth and power
Engineering	The application of scientific knowledge for practical purposes
Geometry	developed it because floods required them to regularly redraw boundaries; also needed for pyramids
Hieroglyphics	Egypt's form of writing; one of the first in the world
King Tut	tomb was left untouched for 3000 years; provides much evidence about the civilization

Lower Egypt	Located in the northern section of Egypt
Mummies	Specially treated bodies wrapped in cloth
New Kingdom	high point of power and prosperity
Nile River	The longest river in the world
Nobles	People from rich and powerful families

Old Kingdom	A period in Egyptian history that lasted for about 500 years, from about 2700 - 2200 BC
Papyrus	Egyptian writing material made from reeds; very similar to paper
Pharaoh	The title used by the rulers of Egypt
Pyramids	Built in ancient Egypt as tombs for pharaohs
Red Land	deadly desert on outer sides of the Black Land

Rosetta Stone	same message was written in 3 languages on it; one was Hieroglyphics and this was the key that unlocked the Egyptian language
Upper Egypt	Located in the southern section of Egypt
